CUMRU TOWNSHIP BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING DECEMBER 19, 2017

The Regular Meeting of the Cumru Township Board of Commissioners was called to order by President Ruth O'Leary at 7:02 p.m. Other Commissioners in attendance were Sheri Hoover and Lorri Swan. Vice President Edward L. Gottschall and Tony J. Sacco were absent. Also attending were Solicitor Michael A. Setley, Superintendent of Public Works Robert McNichols, Jr., Assistant Superintendent of Public Works Michael L. Yost, Business/Personnel Administrator Peggy A. Carpenter, Manager Jeanne E. Johnston, Secretary Latoya Procopio, and Joseph P. Rogosky of Great Valley Consultants.

A) Victor Chelladurai re: 8 Brassie Circle sewer bill

Mr. Chelladurai expressed concern for his November sewer bill, approximately \$1,700. Mr. Chelladurai stated that he had landscaped his yard for his son's graduation party this past summer; he did not realize that the water was left on while they went on vacation. He realized that the water had been left on when the water bill came in. He paid the water bill, but when the sewer bill came in, he came into the Township Building to request a sewer credit.

Mr. Chelladurai acknowledged that Ms. Johnston had informed him of the process to request a sewer credit and that landscaping does not qualify for a sewer credit. He requested that the Board of Commissioners grant an exception.

Mr. Setley stated that the Municipal Authority recently denied a similar situation regarding a resident's landscaping water usage. The Board of Commissioners referred the matter to the Authority. The Board agreed to defer any penalties on the 8 Brassie Circle sewer account until Mr. Chelladurai attends the 1/11/18 Authority meeting and obtains a decision.

B) Rosemary Blair re: handicapped parking at 1626 Gregg Street

Ms. Blair stated that the Township had granted her application for a handicapped parking space in front of her home and a sign was installed, but no blue lines had been painted. She complained that other people are parking in her handicapped parking spot.

Ms. Blair explained that a former neighbor, who no longer resides at the residence, used to have a handicapped parking space. The sign had been removed, but the blue lines remained.

Since the installation of her handicapped parking space, other people have been utilizing the handicap parking spot. She believed that part of the problem was confusion caused by the remaining blue lines from the former handicapped parking space.

The Board informed Ms. Blair that anyone who has a handicapped placard is able to park in a handicapped parking spot. Chief Winchester confirmed that the sign designated the space, not blue lines. Mr. McNichols stated that blue lines are no longer painted; the old ones would fade over time. Ms. Blair suggested painting over the lines. Mr. McNichols informed the Board that a shadow of the lines would still be visible, whether the lines are painted over or eradicated. Ms.

Blair offered to pay for the rental of an eradicator and the Board requested that Public Works look into it.

C) Barry Rohrbach re: ambulance service

Mr. Rohrbach of 17 Muirfield Drive stated that he had served on the Planning Commission for over 10 years and then held the title of Commissioner for 3 full terms. He expressed to the Board that he was concerned that the contract with Southern Berks EMS was for only 6 months. He stated that he became aware that the Township was talking to Western Berks Ambulance Association. He requested that the Board consider a full 1 year contract with SBREMS. As a Commissioner, he never received any reports that Southern Berks Regional Emergency Services did anything other than a fine job.
